

Electric Fencing Kits For Horses & Poultry

Everyone should realize that the electric fencing you need for horses is quite different from the electric fencing you need for poultry. Horses do not tend to have a predator such as a fox trying to enter into their domain as do chickens. Horses need more room than chickens and in most cases need temporary fencing needs in order to move them for grazing purposes whereas chickens do not.

To ensure you have the proper electric fencing for the type of animal you wish to contain and protect you can now purchase electric fence kits. The horse fence kits will have everything you need whether you desire permanent fencing or temporary fencing. The electric poultry starter kits have all that you need including electric poultry netting if you choose this type of fencing.

Horses are fast moving creatures that love to run while grazing and with the strip grazing kit, you will be ensured that your horse will not have any problems staying in their allotted area with the highly visible polytape or polyrope that comes complete in the kit. For a more permanent solution, you can find horse fence kits that offer polytwine or polywire instead of polytape. Polytape is often used for temporary fencing, which is easier to move when needed to ensure your horse does not eat more than it should or to give it more grazing area as needed.

With chickens and other small creatures, electric poultry netting is often the best bet for you electric fence kit. You can choose how much netting you need as the netting comes with easy clips so you can clip more netting as needed so you have plenty of room for your chickens. Along with keeping your chickens in a specific area, you will also be keeping out predators such as fox that love chicken coops.

The good news with horse fence kits and chicken netting is that both have various purposes. The electric fence used for horses can also be used for cattle whereas the electric chicken netting can be used to keep rabbits out of your crops or vegetable garden as well as keeping herons out of garden pond.

Instead of searching around trying to decide what type of electric fencing you require, you should visit with your local electric fence supplier and explain the area you wish to fence, if you need it to be permanent or temporary, what animal you need to contain, and if you wish to use a main or battery energiser. The professional at the suppliers should be able to answer all of your questions so you can purchase the electric fence kit that will work for your situation and protect your property and livestock. Remember, not all electric fencing is created equal and the fence that will keep horses in an area will not keep fox away from your chickens.
